

WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings with this May issue of The Chimes. We have celebrated Easter Sunday and now enter the Christian Year with the seven Sundays of Easter which will take us to Pentecost Sunday, June 4.

Along the way we will have our Annual Meeting on May 21 and Bible studies beginning May 7. So far there are nine people attending. There is room for many more. As before, these will be after worship and a short time of fellowship in the hall. Take your snacks and coffee to the Bible study room. This year's study will be in two parts:

- (1) The images of God's Salvation in Christian history and
- (2) The images we have of Jesus Christ.

The Annual Meeting will interrupt one session and the Endowment meeting of June 30 another. So, we will overlap into June.

At our Annual Meeting we will receive reports from the various leaders of our ministries. The budget will be discussed and voted upon. We will have time to discuss future issues, such as the Jordon's Crossing's proposal to use our facility. We need to prayerfully discern God's movement in this proposal of a new ministry.

Another transitional challenge is that I plan to retire for the third time. I retired in 2008 from Nebraska. I retired again in 2010 after having served six months here at First Congregational Church. Then, when Pastor Carl became ill in 2012 I returned and have been here ever since. I will renew my contact May 31st until the end of the year 2017. *That is if you want me to do so*.

I have been in contact watts the UCC Northern CA/NV Conference. The search and call minister has said that when the time is right, and they are invited by you, they will come and assist you in your search for a new pastor, interim or settled. I strongly encourage you to do this. The Conference has Search and call specialists with wide access to ministers that are in relocation processes. The Conference also has skills in assisting you in discerning your needs for the future, building on what you have already accomplished.

Ministerial ethics dictate I not be involved in this process although I will continue to be your pastor until the end of the year. This process, being done in an accountable way, will certainly take that amount of time. December 31, 2017 will bring us to the first Sunday after Christmas and a proactive way to launch into a New Year.

I look forward to being with you in worship and study as our "New Year" begins.



Again, the boy slowly counted his money. "May I have some plain ice cream in a dish then, please?" He gave the waitress the correct amount, and she brought him the ice cream.


