It was reported that the two old sheds have not been removed as yet due to the weather.

PG&E has replaced the gas lines under the driveway.

The YMCA is working on the possible lease of the Sunday School (Annex) building. They would like to expand their children's and other programs. Currently they rent some of the rooms at different dates. We do not make a profit but cover costs.

The pest control company has been giving our buildings a good once-over. It has been a busy rodent season all over town due to excessive rain.

It was noted that Cal-Water has requested a 1.9% rate increase. We don't need that!

It was noted that we do not have flood insurance. The cost would be very

high and over budget. We are trusting in past history and do I dare say, "The government fixing the spillway?"

Pastor Jerry Hambleton will be retiring the end of this year. Replacement procedure was discussed. The Council will chose a search committee.

The proposed 2017-18 budget was discussed. At present, we do not have enough pledges to cover our expenses.

Unfortunately, we have lost many of our members due to their moving away or deaths. We miss those lost very much and want to keep our historical church open to all.



Department of Education lot on the SW corner of Lincoln & Bird.




